

The Dru R. '80 and M. Scott Cone '82 Scholarship was awarded for the first time this fall to a high-achieving petroleum engineering student in the Nelson Scholars Program. Funded by a \$60,000 endowment at the Texas A&M Foundation, the scholarship award is merit-based, and recipients must maintain a 3.0 grade-point average. "The Texas A&M petroleum engineering degree I received prepared me well for a future in the energy business, and I want to help others have the same opportunity," said Scott Cone, President of Tri-C Resources. As a Finance major, **Scott Terry** saw up close the effect of the generosity of the Aggie family: his roommate received a President's Endowed Scholarship. **Terry** thought to himself, maybe someday I could do that for a student.

Now, more than 30 years later, **Scott** hasn't forgotten that desire. He has committed to a planned gift of \$100,000, which will be used to endow a President's Endowed Scholarship at Mays. A senior vice president for Merrill Lynch in Tyler, **Scott** works in

financial planning and wealth management. He says he frequently counsels his clients to add philanthropic activity to their estate planning. "I decided it was time to eat some of my own cooking," he says.

Joking aside, **Scott** says that as a former student and as an Aggie parent, he understands his obligation to give back to the school. "If we fail to reinvest in the institutions that have benefitted us, then we have failed those that enabled our success," he says. **Scott** hopes that his gift will enable future generations of Aggies to find success at Mays.

Two of **Scott's** four children have graduated from A&M, one with a degree in business and the other with a business minor. "The business school is a special place for me," says **Scott**.

Scott earned his CPA license and joined (what is now) Bank of America after graduation. He spent 17 years in the Dallas, Midland, and Tyler offices, working in Commercial Lending. He has been with Merrill Lynch for 13 years.

## UNIVERSITY HIGHLIGHTS back to top

- TAMU President Dr. Loftin is only the fifth A&M President that is also a graduate of A&M.

• A&M's fall 2011 enrollment was 49,129 at the main campus (51,500 if you take into account all campuses), making us the largest university in Texas. That also means that our freshman Class was a whopping 8,400. The 8,400 were chosen from over 30,000 applicants.

• While a full 25 percent of the freshman Class came from families where there was no history of a college education, Dr. Loftin said that A&M must continue to diversify to better reflect the current makeup of Texas' population. The current student population is 4 percent African American and 14 percent Hispanic.

• A&M is making progress in increasing the size of the Corps of Cadets. For the first time in 10 years, we have over 2,000 men and women in the Corps.

• Dr. Loftin commented that one of the most successful avenues for students to gain enrollment to A&M if they are not one of the initial 8,400 that are chosen is to join via the Blinn Team. There are 800 students who are admitted to both A&M and Blinn and are fully integrated into A&M because they can live on campus and take courses at both schools. The success is reflected in their GPA being higher than those who come directly into A&M as freshman and take classes only on A&M's main campus.

• TAMU's new Commandant of the Corps of Cadets is Joe E. Rameriz, Jr. '79. Brigadier General Ramirez is A&M's 39th Commandant. For his bio, click here. His three objectives are:

- Raising the academic standing of the Corps
- Recruiting and retention
- Increasing diversity

• Texas A&M had 17 Aggies in the Beijing Olympics and could have as many as 27 in the upcoming 2012 London Olympics.

• The fundraising effort for Olson Field has reached the goal of \$24 million. Construction started in February 2011, and the field should be ready for play in 2012. Blue Bell Creameries out of Brenham pledged the final \$7 million. The official name of the facility will be C.E. "Pat" Olsen Field at Blue Bell Park.

• Kyle Field and its outdoor track are next in line for renovation. Design work has been ongoing for the past two years.
