## 2006 LEADERSHIP COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Here are my notes from the Leadership Council general session. I should probably have taped the session because my pen did not go anywhere nearly as fast as the speakers. So here is a bit of scatter shooting.....

Van Taylor '71 was introduced by Porter S. Garner, III '79 to kick off the meeting. Van is our new President for The Association of Former Students. Van recently retired from a senior executive position with SBC in Dallas and will be building a house in College Station. Van was instrumental in developing a strategic plan in 2005 to help position The Association of Former Students as the premier association in the country. We will see and hear more about this plan in the upcoming months.

So what is The Association's Strategic Plan? In short, The Association wants to communicate effectively and efficiently with the Aggie Network, increase participation and involvement, raise friends and funds for A&M and The Association, and deliver excellent customer service.

I couldn't believe it when I heard the Clayton W. Williams, Jr. Alumni Center is now 19 years old. Quite a bit has changed at A&M in 19 years. The Association is experiencing growing pains as from 1983 to 2004 the number of students increased from 35,000 to 44,435, the Former Students increased from 101,732 to 241,142 and the staff (at The Association) increased from 29 to 64. You will soon be seeing plans on how we will increase the size of our building to accommodate the growth.


General Hal Hornburg '68 is the Chair of the Fundraising Committee and gave a solid overview of the Annual Fund. As Former Students, we raised \$6.3 million against a goal of \$6.75 million in 2005. In hindsight this was a remarkable achievement when you consider the year started off with a tsunami and ended with two devastating hurricanes. Aggies opened their hearts and their wallets making a tremendous impact on those affected by these terrible natural disasters.

The One Spirit One Vision campaign had a goal to raise \$1 billion dollars by the end of this year. At the end of 2005, we reached \$1.1 billion. What a great step to increase the excellence and prominence of our school.

Dr. Robert M. Gates was insightful, entertaining and showed why he is becoming such a strong leader for A&M. As you are aware, Dr. Gates wants to add 447 professors to the faculty over a five year period. By this September, we will have added 346. I must admit, I usually look at these things in financial terms. The dollars are certainly important but when I look at it in terms of the education my son will get because his Class sizes are already decreasing and will be down to a ratio of 17 or 18 to 1 in the near future, I get excited. The numbers of classes that have 50+ students were 33% and are now approaching 25%. As near as A&M can tell, this is the most aggressive expansion in history. Another way to look at this is A&M is taking strong steps to set ourselves up as a market leader while giving a better quality of education to our existing students.

Dr. Gates spoke about the continued increase in diversity at A&M. The total number of applications submitted to A&M this past year was over 20,000. African American applications have increased by 13% and applications by Hispanic students have increased 12%.

Another topic was on the challenge of providing a strong education to the 3,000 to 5,000 students at A&M that have a grade point of around 2.0. These kids' grades are solid enough but do not allow them to get into the majors they want such as business and engineering. Dr. Gates has tasked Dean Jerry Strawser '83 (Mays College of Business) to come up with a plan that will allow students to customize their degree plans to an extent allowing them to take the courses they are interested in and motivate them while still maintaining rigorous academic standards

## Texas A&M Foundation Update

Jim Palincsar gave us an update on the news at the Foundation. First, I have always wondered what is the Texas A&M Foundation and what does it do? Jim said, "The Foundation gets gifts, invests the gifts, and provides scholarships to Aggies." As far as getting gifts, The Foundation will finish up the "One Spirit One Vision" campaign this year with total gifts of approximately 1.4 billion dollars. The fourth quarter was the best in the history of the Foundation with \$23 million in gifts. On the investment side, The A&M Foundation provides the investment management services for all of the money raised by the A&M Foundation, The Association of Former Students and The 12<sup>th</sup> Man Foundation. The average return on investment for the last four years has been about 12% per year. Man, I wish they were investing my money. The Foundation has several scholarship programs that donate money to deserving students. Just to mention a few, the President's

Endowed Scholarship program provides over 700 scholarships, the Sul Ross and Rudder scholarships benefit the Corps, the Foundation Excellence Awards benefit minority students and Endowed scholarships are available to well rounded and highly motivated incoming freshman. Jim said, "We are trying to make A&M a better place" and "We are looking for former students that want to help and want to make a difference."

## FINANCIAL AID

## **S**CHOLARSHIP PRESENTATION

Leadership Council Weekend ended with Dr. Alice Reinarz and Mr. Joseph Pettibon, II '92 presenting a discussion about financial aid and scholarship opportunities available for A&M students. We have new Prospective Student Centers staffed with full-time admissions and financial aid professionals in Houston, Corpus Christi, Dallas/Ft Worth, San Antonio, and McAllen. A&M has a race-blind admissions policy, and no points are awarded for legacy. Admissions is unbelievably competitive and getting more so. There were 21,000 applicants in September 2005 competing for only 7,000 seats for fall 2006 admission. The average SAT score was 1220. Thank goodness it was easier in 1976 or some of us would never have been Classmates. Forty-eight percent of this year's applicants were lucky enough to have graduated in the Top 10% of their high schools and thus qualified for automatic admission. The other 52% were subjected to the new admissions review process. Admission is now earned on a relative assessment based on each year's pool of candidates. The academic achievement and subjective

evaluation (personal achievement and distinguishing characteristics) of each individual candidate is evaluated on the Admissions Review Decision Matrix. Additional information is available on the web at www.tamu. edu/admissions.

As those of us with current students know too well, the average cost of attendance at A&M for the 2005 - 2006 academic year was just under \$17,000. Tuition and fees were \$6,400. In 1994, tuition and fees were only \$1,000. Approximately 33% or about 15,000 of the current students qualify for need-based financial aid. Seventy-five percent of currently enrolled Aggies receive some type of financial assistance (loans, grants, scholarships, tuition waivers, student employment). Concerning scholarships, Pettibon suggested completing as many applications as you can. The scholarship deadline for Texas A&M is January 10 with one exception. 
